## A MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER

The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically impacted the way we are able to deliver vital public services and programs to our residents, businesses, partners and stakeholders in Menifee. In order to support county, state and federal mandates designed to help slow the spread of this new pandemic, City Hall temporarily closed to the public on March 20, 2020. However, the City quickly transformed City Hall to offer residents, businesses and stakeholders' efficient alternatives, such as the new virtual City Hall and Zero Stop Shop for permitting, as a way to ensure key City business continued in an efficient, safe and cautious manner.

The Menifee City Council declared a local emergency on March 18, 2020. This measure allows the City to respond quickly to the rapid needs and everchanging mandates to address the COVID-19 crisis, as well as be eligible for critical state and federal emergency funding to aide and address issues locally.

The city has also responded quickly to help stem the spread of this virus by canceling or postponing local city public events, classes, programs and activities. These measures, by order of the County Public Health Official encourages social distancing, which is proven to be one of the most effective measures in combating this virus, along with hand washing, face coverings, and staying home.

**Despite these changes, our goal remains to provide uninterrupted service delivery to you during this unprecedented time.**

Staff has recalibrated service delivery models, both internally and externally, to account for this new virtual reality. We have activated new technology to provide more services online through our interactive website. We are increasing our outreach on social media, enhancing our telephone and email capabilities to further enhance the excellent customer service the City of Menifee has become known for as a City, and have been working with our businesses to ensure they have the support and resources to begin recovery now and once this crisis is on the mend.

Supporting you in the way you've come to expect from Menifee City Hall – along with ensuring the health and safety of our staff, our businesses, and our overall community – will always be our top priority.

Just as you are adjusting to the new reality of staying home and social distancing, we are also adjusting to our new realities. We kindly request your patience as we do our very best to continue serving you under these new circumstances, guidelines and mandates.



Through droplets when an infected person coughs or sneezes.


Close personal contact, such as caring for an infected person.

Symptoms may appear 1-14 days after exposure.




### Stay in Place

The California State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public Health have ordered all individuals living in the State of California to stay home or at their place of residence, except as needed to maintain continuity of operation of the federal critical infrastructure sectors.



### Cover your Face

Recent reports have suggested that the coronavirus can spread through the air. When people are infected with respiratory viruses, they emit viral particles whenever they talk, breathe, cough, or sneeze. Those infected with the virus can be asymptomatic. When in public, cover your face with a bandana, neck gaiter, or homemade face covering.



### Maintain your Space

All residents should be using social distancing; refrain from group activities, cancel all non-essential shopping, and maintain a 6 foot space around you at all times.



### Do Not Purchase Masks

Medical masks such as surgical and N95 masks are in short supply and needed by health care professionals. To prevent shortages, the public should avoid purchasing these masks.

## CITY HALL UPDATES

### City of Menifee Signs Proclamation of Local Emergency

The City of Menifee formalized a Proclamation of Local Emergency on March 18 based on the rapidly evolving challenges to slow the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Riverside County. The City's emergency proclamation will enable the City to streamline logistical resources and recovery measures needed to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. It was voted on unanimously by the Menifee City Council present at the March 18 Council meeting and was signed into order by Mayor Bill Zimmerman.

The City Council acknowledges the necessity of swift measures to ensure the public health and safety of our community remains a top priority, and recognizes the importance of Menifee to continue to practice kindness, patience and civility. The current restrictions placed upon all cities are temporary, and are being applied by the County and State to ensure the safety and well-being of our families and businesses, while minimizing impacts to those on the frontline of the pandemic.

The City has closed all community facilities to the public and canceled or postponed events, classes and activities at the direction of RUHS-Public Health Official to encourage social distancing, and to stem COVID-19 cases within our region that could overwhelm local hospitals and supplies needed to care for local patients.

### Parks, Parking Lots and Recreation Facilities Closed

All City athletic fields, sports courts, Skate Park, dog parks, and all City playgrounds are closed among many other temporary closures. The Riverside County Public Health Official ordered all parking lots to City parks and recreational facilities to close as well until further notice. ### Virtual City Hall and Zero-Stop Shop for Development

The City of Menifee is committed to helping our community navigate and receive necessary information and resources during the pandemic, while keeping projects moving forward. Menifee will provide an enhanced level of service and support and keep our business-friendly demeanor in the new Virtual City Hall and Zero-Stop Shop, despite the temporary closures to city facilities.

A new City webpage, Virtual City Hall, includes virtual permit activities to process projects from all stages of development, as well as community service classes, programs or activities virtually for all ages at [cityofmenifee.us/communityservices](http://cityofmenifee.us/communityservices).

Under the City's Streamline Initiative, Menifee



transformed its one-stop shop permit counter to a zero-stop shop virtual permit center, eliminating the need to come to City Hall altogether. Stakeholders, businesses, and residents can access the online portal to submit projects online, conduct virtual inspections, and meetings, and perform normal operating business from the ease of their home or essential business.

"This effort was led by the Rapid Response Development team, and spearheaded by the City's Community Development Department, transforming the way the development process occurs," explained Gina Gonzalez, the City's Economic Development Director. "This ultimately enhances safety, while also saving time and money and further proving Menifee's priority of being business friendly."

## Business License Renewal Deadline Extended to June 30, 2020

Recognizing the economic impact that the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) will have on local businesses, the City has extended the deadline to renew annual business licenses from January 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020. Depending on the evolution of the COVID-19 pandemic, additional extensions may be granted.

City Manager Armando Villa said, “Our businesses are a vital and cherished part of our community. We understand the impact the federal, state and county orders have on local businesses. This is just one action of many as part of a City Business Relief/Recovery Program that the City has implemented to provide much needed relief to our businesses during this unprecedented time.”

To facilitate social distancing and as a precaution to help prevent the spread of COVID-19, the City of Menifee requests residents participate in City Council and Planning Commission meetings virtually by submitting public comments in advance and then live streaming council and commission meetings from a remote location.

## Senior Assistance from City



The City has opened the Kay Cenicerros Senior Center, 29995 Evans Road, ONLY for organizing central donations for food and other essential supplies and is closed for its normal programming and activities.

**The City has set up a questions service line at (951) 672-9673 that is available Monday through Friday from 8 am to 5 pm to assist at-risk residents with food, essential needs and other COVID-19 related questions.**

At-risk populations include seniors 65 years old or better, those with chronic health conditions, and anyone with special needs.

Churches, organizations or individuals interested in donating food, water or essential items including toilet paper, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap and masks, should call the service line to inquire first with staff on needs and drop-off locations.

# ESSENTIAL CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE WORKERS

The term “essential business” or “essential service” has been used by state and federal officials to define industries and employment sectors that do not need to close during the statewide stay-at-home order because they are critical for the health and safety of the state. These organizations should practice social distancing and employees should discuss their schedules with their supervisors, be protected and wear a mask at all times.



## HEALTHCARE/PUBLIC HEALTH

Public and private healthcare facilities, research centers, suppliers, manufacturers, information technology systems required for care delivery and support.



## EMERGENCY SERVICES SECTOR

Public safety personnel including police, fire, sheriff, public works, private security, and private emergency medical services providers.



## FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

Production, processing, and delivery systems to feed people and animals, including growers, processors, suppliers, transporters, distributors, grocers and restaurants.



## COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Physical and cyber infrastructure that enables people to contact one another, access information, and communicate from remote areas.



## OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Government services, childcare for healthcare and government workers, utility and sanitation workers, construction industry, plumbing, laundry services, homeless services, professional services, animal care and other support industries.



## HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Nuclear waste, medical waste (including pharmaceuticals and lab waste), and other hazardous materials management operations.



## CHEMICAL

This sector produces end-products like basic, specialty and agriculture chemicals; pharmaceuticals; and other consumer products.



## TRANSPORTATION AND LOGISTICS

Seven key subsectors: 1) Aviation; 2) Highway and Motor Carrier encompasses roadway, bridges, and tunnels; 3) Vehicles; 4) Maritime Transportation; 5) Mass Transit and Passenger Rail; 6) Pipeline Systems carrying natural gas hazardous liquids, various chemicals; and 7) Freight Rail.



## ENERGY

Critical infrastructure for electricity oil, and natural gas including the production, refining, storage, and distribution.



## CRITICAL MANUFACTURING

Primary metals, machinery, electrical equipment, appliance and components, and transportation equipment that serve other critical industries.



## WATER AND WASTEWATER

Drinking water and wastewater services, which provide for public health, environmental protection, and security measures.



## FINANCIAL SERVICES

Financial and credit institutions, investment firms, insurance companies, and providers of critical services that support these functions.



## DEFENSE INDUSTRIAL BASE

Enables research and development, design, production, delivery, and maintenance of military systems along with products and services essential to military operations.
